




euroart – the European Federation of Artists' Colonies – was established in 1994 in Brussels under the auspices of the European Parliament and the European Commission.

Today, euroart consists of around 100 member organizations, associate organizations, and individual members from 45 artists' colonies across 13 European countries: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, German, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, and Russia. Members collaborate on exhibitions, share knowledge and ideas, and facilitate artist exchanges. At the annual meetings, in addition to staying informed about developments in each artists' colony, members work together to promote greater cultural understanding and cooperation within a European framework.






