

The Solingen Artists' Colony "Black House" owes its origins to the commitment and attraction of intellectuals and free spirits. First and foremost to the work of a very educated, self-confident and emancipated lady Erna Heinen-Steinhoff (1898-1969).





A meeting place developed for painters, writers, musicians and intellectuals. In this environment, the felt and thought as well as the artistically designed were of far greater importance than the material itself.





Essentially, the impressive and lasting work of a community of artists took place in this place, which achieved an art-historically significant and lasting rank in the visual arts of the 20th century through its own style, completely detached from the spirit of the times.

Over the years, the literary protagonists were joined by three important painters. Erwin Bowien (1899-1972), Bettina Heinen-Ayech (1937-2020) and Amud Uwe Millies (1932-2008). Together, the three painting protagonists of the colony formed the "Painter Triumvirate" of Solingen.





The spirit of the Artist Colonists

In opposition to the prevailing "spirit of the times" at the time, which favored abstraction in the wake of classical modernism, the Artist Colonists of the "Black House" painted representationally. Oil paints, pastels and watercolors were used.





They created portraits, landscapes, city views and pictorially captured scenes of everyday life. They found their motifs in the green vegetation of their surroundings and on their many and extensive journeys.





The idea of international understanding was a major concern of the Artist **Colonists. Erwin Bowien, was a European** before time and dreamed of a united and peaceful Europe. Bettina Heinen-Ayech was very concerned about bringing both sides of the Mediterranean - Orient and **Occident - closer together and Amud Uwe** Millies was fascinated by the Middle and Far East, the two parts of America.



The protagonists of the Artists' Colony always had the international dialogue of cultural workers and cooperation across national and cultural borders, such as with residents of Monte Verità at Lago Maggiore, in mind, especially in confusing and confused times marked by exile, expulsion and wars.



The art historian Cristina Streckfuss wrote about the Colony: "If one then risks a look as far as Murnau, the artists' group of the "Blaue Reiter", then the Solingen Artists' **Colony is spiritually more related to the** avantgarde Parisian salons in the circle around Pablo Picasso, Gertrude and Leo Stein".






Erna Heinen-Steinhoff (1898-1969)

As muse of the arts created Erna Heinen-Steinhoff a literary salon in the manner of the 19th century in Solingen at the beginning of the 1920s.






Hanns Heinen (1895-1961)

Together with his wife Erna Heinen-Steinhoff, the journalist, author and poet Hanns Heinen became an important patron of the arts.






Erwin Bowien (1899–1972)

The first painter of the Artists' Colony, Erwin Bowien, was always a convinced European, long before the idea became popular and thus far ahead of his time.





Erwin Bowien (1899–1972)

Numerous painting trips took Erwin Bowien to Switzerland several times, among other places. Here he created richly colored mountain pictures, which he painted mainly in oils, in contrast to his otherwise light and airy pastels.





Erwin Bowien (1899–1972)

Erwin Bowien was an opponent of National Socialism and had accepted one last commission in Germany in the winter of 1933 before he was finally forced to go into exile in Holland due to political developments. After the occupation of the **Netherlands by the Wehrmacht, he made** an adventurous escape through Germany.







Erwin Bowien (1899–1972)

In the small Allgäu community of Kreuzthal, **Bowien survived the Nazi period illegally in** hiding, protected only by the local village policeman. In the meantime, his paintings were confiscated by the Gestapo and the **Reich Chamber of Culture issued an** exhibition ban.






Bettina Heinen-Ayech (1937–2020)

As the most important painter of the Artist Colony, Bettina Heinen-Ayech shaped an independent, post-impressionist style of art with expressive elements that can rightly claim its place in the art world.






Bettina Heinen-Ayech (1937–2020)

Bettina Heinen-Ayech was considered a tempestuous talent even at a young age, fighting her watercolor battles and receiving encouragement from none other than Karl Schmidt-Rottluff: "Bettina, stay true to yourself!". Despite her youth, her paintings were included in a representative exhibition of modern German art from Beckmann to Kirchner that was sent all over the world.




Bettina Heinen-Ayech (1937-2020)

Bettina Heinen-Ayech leaves behind a grandiose, diverse oeuvre and her works are present in museums, archives and public collections in Europe and North Africa. She uncompromisingly painted what she saw and the way she saw it - using a kind of "mosaic technique" and intensive colors.






Amud Uwe Millies (1932–2008)

Amud Uwe Millies wanted to paint, to express himself, and to capture artistically all that revealed itself so impressively and lastingly to his senses and feelings.






Amud Uwe Millies (1932–2008)

Amud Uwe Millies cultivated a special, individual painting technique by applying the oil paint very discreetly and thinly and was also careful to use very delicate colors. This often gives the impression at first glance that it is not really an oil painting but a pastel.


