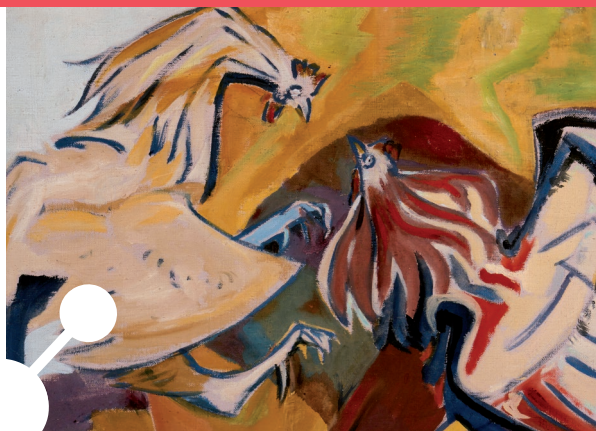

euroart – the European Federation of Artists' Colonies – came into being in 1994. It was founded in Brussels under the auspices of the European Parliament and the European Commission. euroart currently consists of about 100 member organizations, associated organizations and personal members in 45 artists' colonies in 13 European countries: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania, Netherlands, Norway, Poland and Russia. The members hold exhibitions together, exchange views, knowledge and artists. And in annual meetings, next to keeping each other informed of developments in their several colonies, they all work together towards a greater cultural understanding and cooperation in a European context.
